**RESOLUTION APPROVING USE OF INTERIM AGREEMENTS TO EXTEND THE TERMS OF  
FISCAL YEAR 2005/06 CONTRACTS INTO THE FIRST SIX MONTHS OF FISCAL YEAR 2006/07  
FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH**

WHEREAS, the contractors listed on Attachment “A” currently provide health services to the residents of San Francisco through contracts with the Department of Public Health; and

WHEREAS, the renewal of these contracts may not be completed through the regular contract processes prior to their expiration dates, which are June 30, 2006, or earlier, thereby causing financial hardship to the contractors listed; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Health Commission that these contractors continue to be paid as much as possible at the 2005/06 contract rate(s) as reflected in the final version of their 2005/06 contracts, except when such payments would conflict with the Department’s 2006/07 budget and sources of revenue, in which case adjustments may be made as warranted to ensure compliance as needed with the Department’s 2006/07 budget, taking into account the need to process contracts and contract payments expeditiously; and

WHEREAS, monthly payment to the contractors listed in Attachment “A,” until such time as the availability of funds for these 2006/07 contracts are certified by the Controller, will greatly reduce the financial hardship on these contractors;

WHEREAS, the Health Commission believes that a smooth transition from one contract year to another is important to minimize any disruption in services to San Francisco residents; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Health Commission (Commissioner Illig abstaining as it relates to Project Open Hand, Commissioner Tarver abstaining as it relates to Baker Places and Westside Community Mental Health and Commissioner Chow abstaining as it relates to NICOS) hereby approves the continuation of Department of Public Health contracts through the use of Interim Agreements with those contractors shown in Attachment “A” at the 2005/06 contract rate(s) as reflected in the most recent version of their 2005/06 contracts, except when such payments would conflict with the Department’s 2006/07 budget and sources of revenue, in which case adjustments may be made as warranted to ensure compliance as needed with the Department’s 2006/07 budget, taking into account the need to process contracts and contract payments expeditiously, and until such time as the availability of funds for 2006/07 contracts (“renewals”) is certified by the Controller, or through December 31, 2006 or an earlier date specified by the Department, whichever comes first. After certification of the 2006/07 “renewal” contracts, the contractor will provide an adjustment invoice to reconcile any differences between 2005/06 rates and the final 2006/07 negotiated contracts/rate(s); and be it

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FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Health Commission hereby approves provision in each of the contracts shown in Attachment "A" to allow an initial payment to be paid to all those contractors designated by the Department. Such payment shall not exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the contract's maximum compensation amount of General Fund monies (including any Substance Abuse and Crime Prevention Act/Proposition 36 monies), as applicable, and may be adjusted as determined to be appropriate by the Department to reflect potential changes in the Department's 2006/07 budget; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that in order to ensure the smooth continuation of funding for services, for those contracts which are listed in "Attachment A" which include grant and/or work order funding that continues into 2006/07, adjustments may be made as needed to the exhibits related to these funds to enable their continuation until such time as the availability of funds for 2006/07 contracts ("renewals") is certified by the Controller, or through December 31, 2006 or an earlier date specified by the Department, whichever comes first, in compliance with related grant agreements with grantors and/or the State.
