



TRANSITION ORIENTATION AND TRAINING



CDPH SURVEY FEBRUARY 22nd – 26th, 2016

- 8 CDPH Surveyors inspected all areas of the hospital, including clinical settings throughout the building
- Survey reviewed compliance with Title 22 standards
 - General requirements for each service:
 - √ Staff knowledge
 - ✓ Physical Space
 - ✓ Equipment and Supplies
 - Physical plant
 - Policies and procedures, Governing Body, Quality Assurance Performance Improvement (QAPI) program

2 Critical Findings

- Complete Board of Pharmacy inspection (scheduled March 8, 2016) and medication stocking
- Complete installation of dialysis machines and monitoring
- Continue equipping, stocking, training
- CDPH validation survey first week of May, 2016

LICENSING FOLLOW-UP DELIVERABLES

- 2 Critical items: pharmacy licensing and dialysis completion
- Multiple areas of focus based on Surveyor comments

FUTURE PLANS AND PROJECTS

Bldg. 5 OSHPD Vacancy Plan: Submitted in Dec. 2015. Expect final approval in April 2016.

- OSHPD requires all acute care vacated space in B5 to be secured to achieve Fire Life Safety vacancy standards
- Decommissioning and removal of medical equipment
- Ongoing monitoring plan for facilities and security of unoccupied space

B5 Reclassification to Non-Acute Hospital Building: Will be submitted on May 22, 2016

- Reclassification removes SB1953 performance requirements for B5
- OSHPD does not consider Acute Psych / SNF as an OSHPD-1 Acute Care Service.
 - These services will remain in B5
- ZSFG Staff preparing submittal package to OSHPD, review following acute care services move into B25

FUTURE PLANS AND PROJECTS (CONT'D)

Change of OSHPD Use and Licensed Occupancy: Tentative start date of November 2016

- Establish Program → Define Use → Determine Occupancy
- Individual projects within B5 will determine the future use and occupancy
- Timeline to be developed in May 2016 when project details are determined

Building 25 Follow-On Projects

- Renovation projects (e.g. hybrid MRI, 7th fl. space program, forensics unit)
- Infrastructure improvements (e.g. redundant power, emergency-power for chiller, life safety communications, security systems, data communications, kitchen electrical capacity)
- Workflow improvements (3P-driven)
