CONTRIBUTIONS TO DIVERSITY

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I deeply support UCSF's goal of training a diverse workforce in medicine to support our diverse patient population in the United States. My contributions to diversity are as follows:

1) Mentorship of diverse clinical and research trainees: I strongly believe that dermatology would benefit from a more diverse workforce in both the clinical and research realms. We study and care for the organ with arguably the most obvious visible differences among groups, it is therefore imperative that dermatology's overwhelmingly white workforce should better reflect the population we serve. I am committed to my department's goal of leading the charge to train more URM students in dermatology. I have been a primary clinical and research mentor to three URM students and four LGBT students. I have also participated in UCSF's Diversity, Equity and Inclusion training.

2) Mentorship of women: Although women are now over half of all medical school graduates, they remain under-represented in research and academic medicine. More than half my mentees have been women, many of whom have continued into academic careers. As a mom to two children (ages 6 and 9) I am a constant promoter of family-supportive policies within our department.

3) Commitment to education, research and clinical care benefiting diverse populations. The pillar of my research program has always been to improve the care of all patients, especially diseases and policies that disproportionately affect LGBT persons and persons belonging to racial/ethnic minority groups. A central aspect of my clinical and teaching program has been to promote high-quality, equitable, culturally sensitive and inclusive care for all my patients. In resident teaching, I have specifically focused on skin disease presentations in diverse skin types (dermatology textbooks overwhelmingly show disease in Caucasian skin) and diseases that disproportionately affect minority patients (e.g. hidradenitis, sarcoidosis).

TEACHING AND MENTORING

TEACHING SUMMARY

I have three major teaching activities across my various departmental roles:

1) Precepting dermatology residents, medical students, and family/internal medicine residents in the outpatient and inpatient clinical settings at ZSFG. My teaching activities are comprised of three general adult dermatology clinics weekly, a resident continuity clinic weekly, a surgical clinic monthly, weekly teledermatology sessions, and approximately 17 weeks of attending on the inpatient service per year. Since October 2017, ZSFG dermatology has a dedicated inpatient service run by Dr. Aileen Chang, since then my inpatient precepting occurs over 17 weeks of evenings/weekends and an average of 8 regular workweeks per year.

In 2017, I was awarded Teacher of the Year by the dermatology residents. Annual composite resident evaluations of my teaching consistently score between 4.85-4.9 out of 5.

Administrative and service activities related to resident education include representing ZSFG on the UCSF Department of Dermatology Residency Education Committee, Clinical Competence Committee, and Residency Selection Committee.

2) Course director for all medical student dermatology electives since 2015. Through this administrative role, I oversee and direct the course objectives, and organize supervision and evaluation of all medical students. As part of the new BRIDGES curriculum, I led a full re-design of our medical student electives, effective spring of 2020. I also created a new F2 course, the Dermatology Clinical Immersive Experience (CIEx), which launched in 2019.

3) Formal lectures given to our dermatology residents and across various disciplines within the medical school and beyond, including annual lectures to medical students, nurse practitioner students, internal medicine residents, family medicine practitioners, UC Berkeley Tang Center providers, and more. I also developed a Morphology curriculum and lecture series given to our dermatology residents annually.

MENTORING SUMMARY

Career mentorship and research supervision of medical students, residents and fellows has been a primary focus of my career. Over my ten-year tenure at UCSF, I have formally mentored over twenty trainees in various stages of their careers. For the 2019-20 year, I am the primary mentor for MS4 Lucero Barajas, who is participating in the competitive NIH-funded CTSI-TL1 Yearlong Inquiry Program. Another student, Adam Zakaria, will complete this program for the 2020-21 academic year, and I will be his primary research mentor. Many of my mentees have gone on to academic careers at high-powered programs (University of Pennsylvania, Washington University, and UCSF); students I have mentored have matched in many top dermatology programs including University of Pennsylvania, NYU, Washington University, Stanford, Vanderbilt, UCLA and UCSF.

RESEARCH AND CREATIVE ACTIVITIES SUMMARY

My research program is anchored around improving dermatologic care for vulnerable populations, both in the U.S. and in low-and middle-income countries. After residency, I completed a one-year Dermatology Foundation supported non-ACGME fellowship under the mentorship of Dr. Toby Maurer, which served as the foundation of my research program. My fellowship focused on investigation and clinical care of HIV-infected patients in sub-Saharan Africa (where I lived and worked for six months) and here in San Francisco. Stemming from this formative experience, my research aims are divided into two overarching categories:

1) Investigating epidemiology, clinical care and education, health systems and implementation science, and social determinants of care-seeking for HIV-related dermatologic diseases in the U.S. and sub-Saharan Africa. Specific diseases of interest include Kaposi sarcoma, immune reconstitution inflammatory syndrome, papular pruritic eruption of HIV, and bacillary angiomatosis. I am the PI on a grant from the NCI/CFAR investigating determinants of late-stage diagnosis of Kaposi sarcoma in sub-Saharan Africa, which recently completed enrollment and data is presently being analyzed. I was a founding member and sit on the steering committee of the International Alliance for Global Health Dermatology (GLODERM-<https://gloderm.org/>), an organization for dermatologists doing global health work to present academic work and promote research collaborations.

2) Investigating clinical outcomes, issues of access to care and equity in vulnerable, underserved or under-insured patients in the United States. Specific areas of interest include HIV and STIs, Hepatitis C, homelessness, health policy and access to care for underserved or underinsured patients. In addition to the publications below, I am leading or co-investigating ongoing research into access to dermatology care for Medicaid patients, outcomes of co-morbid skin disease in Hepatitis C-infected persons, cost analysis of teledermatology in our county hospital system, diversifying images and including different skin types in deep machine learning/artificial intelligence algorithms, and disparities in linkage to outpatient dermatologic care after hospitalization. I have been the medical director for the Dermatology Clinic for the Homeless since 2014. I helped organize a working group of dermatologists from county hospitals that meets at the annual American Academy of Dermatology meeting and gives an annual session at the meeting.

Through these projects, I am experienced in grant writing, study design, and data management, as well as mentoring and supervision of medical students, residents, and fellows.
